









What is Ford-RideLondon-Essex?

RideLondon is a legacy event from the London 2012 Olympic Games. Essex will welcome 25,000 cyclists on Sunday 26th May as RideLondon, the world's greatest festival of cycling, returns to the county for its third year in a partnership between RideLondon and Essex County Council.

The partnership brings the Ford RideLondon-Essex 100 and 60 mass participation rides into the county. Local authorities in Essex will also host two stages of the RideLondon Classique; a three-day UCI Women's WorldTour stage race for the best female riders in the world, on Friday 24 May and Saturday 25 May.

Finchingfield

Finchingfield is on the B1052 Braintree to Saffron Walden road, fifty-four miles from London and close to Constable Country. In the time of William the Conqueror it was called Phincingfelda. A textbook example of the traditional English village, Finchingfield is described as the 'most photographed village in England,' Finchingfield has won awards for its traditional picturesque setting.

Colchester Castle

Colchester Castle is one of England's most important heritage sites and is the largest Norman Keep in Europe. Built on the foundations of the Roman Temple of Claudius, today it houses the Castle Museum which is home to archaeological collections of international quality covering 2,500 years of history, including many of the most important Roman finds in Britain.



Places To Watch

The race will begin at 11:00 at Market Square in Saffron Walden and will travel east across the county through the picturesque town of Finchingfield. Head to Halsted High Street for the timed sprint, and if you're local to Colchester watch the best women riders in the world fly through Dedham and Manningtree, before crossing the finish line on East Hill in Colchester City Centre around 15:00.

The Moot Hall


Located in Maldon centre. Moot Hall is a unique Grade I listed heritage building offering guided tours and providing a 360° view from the highest vantage point in the town, offering picturesque views. Thought to have been built around 1420, the tower is part of a brick-built extension to an existing timber manor house known as D'arcy Mansion - the family home of Sir Robert D'arcy (1391-1448).

Promenade Park

Promenade Park is the largest waterside park in Essex, providing a fun-filled, family friendly destination all year round with amazing events and activities throughout the year. Nestled between the historic high street and Blackwater Estuary, the park features a water Splash Park, beach huts and deckchairs for hire. sandpits, galleon play ship and aerial zipwire, model boating and crabbing lake as well as cafe kiosks and picnic areas.

Maldon High Street

The race will begin at 11:00 from Promenade Park when the riders will head up the High Street and down Market Hill ready for the official start in Goldhanger Road at 11:05. The riders are expected to come through the town again just after 13:00, for the first of three laps. The final climb up Market Hill is expected to take place around 14:15.


Promenade Park Saturday 25th May 9am-12:30pm

Chigwell

Chigwell is a nearby town with historical significance. Take a walk in Hainault Forest and enjoy what nature has to offer, or visit Fox Burrow Farm with the family. Famous novelist Charles Dickens once described Chigwell as "the greatest place in the world" in his book Barnaby Rudge.

Epping Forest

On route, Epping Forest is an ancient woodland that has been managed since Neolithic times, making it one of the oldest managed landscapes in the world! It's a haven for people and wildlife, offering open grasslands, majestic woodlands, deep ponds and the sounds of birds and insects.

Ongar Castle and Railway

On route, Ongar Castle, also known as Ongar Motte, is a medieval motte-and-bailev castle believed to have been built in the 11th century. The Epping Ongar Railway is a heritage railway line that operates vintage steam and diesel trains, offering visitors a nostalgic journey through the countryside.











Key Landmarks along the route

The Rodings

The Rodings are a collection of eight villages originating from the Saxon invasion of the sixth century. The area is rich in timber-framed manor houses, farms and thatched cottages. It was once an area with an abundance of windmills but today only one remains with the sails still turning at Aythorpe Roding.

Great Dunmow

Great Dunmow is the halfway point of the ride, including a Pit Stop at the top of Braintree Road (CM6 1AP) which will feature:

- Toilets and water stop
- Refreshments and entertainment
- Bike repair/maintenance

The town is steeped in history, dating back to Roman times, and is famous for its "Flitch Trials" which take place on every leap year. Mentioned in Chaucer's The Canterbury Tales, couples must convince a jury of six local bachelors and six local maidens that they have never wished themselves un-wed for a year and a day. If successful, the couple receive a flitch of bacon as a prize.

Felstead

A few miles further on, you'll be able to enjoy the atmosphere of Felsted, a picturesque village most famous for its school. which has links to Oliver Cromwell, who sent his sons there. More recently, Felsted was one of the villages Stage Three of the Tour de France passed through in 2014 when the event came to the UK.

Hylands House

Hylands Estate is a prestigious Grade II* listed public park encompassing 574 acres of historic parkland. The beautifully renovated Neo-Classical elegant villa Hylands House include formal Victorian Gardens and ancient woodlands. also an award winning accessible children's Adventure Playground.

Great Notley Country Park

The Country Park covers some 100 acres of open space. The site is home to Sky Ropes and Essex's longest play trail. Explore the 1.2km play trail featuring a giant see-saw, climbing forest, tyre swings, sand play area, rope climbers, slides, forts and much more.

Chelmsford Museum

Chelmsford Museum reopened in 2019 to take you through Chelmsford's history, from the Ice Age, right through to the present day. From the chance to see a mammoth. or watch a princely Anglo-Saxon burial, to finding out what used to be on your street, the museum has something for everyone.
